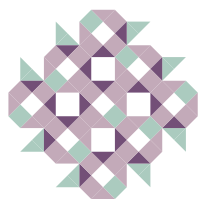

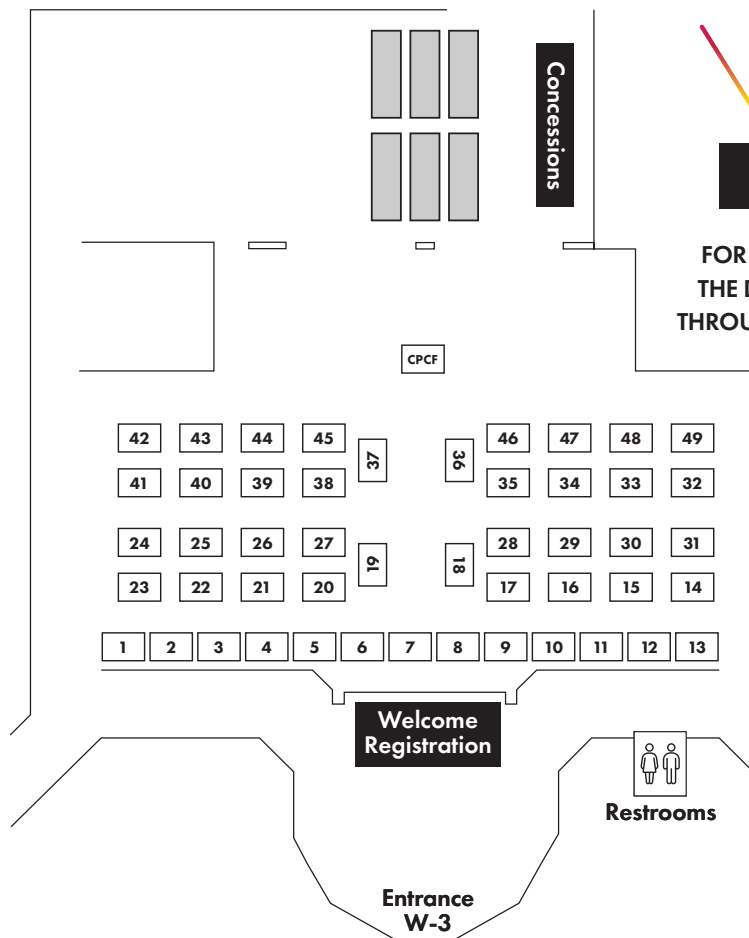

VOLUNTEER FAIR UNITES NWI THROUGH SERVICE

Celebrating 17 Years of Connecting the Community

The annual Volunteer Fair & Blood Drive, sponsored by the Crown Point Community Foundation, has been connecting nonprofits and potential volunteers for 17 years. Held annually at Crown Point High School, the Volunteer Fair gathers dozens of nonprofits together in one place, giving community members the unique chance to learn about the groups' missions and volunteer opportunities in one convenient location.
